What is Navigators 20s/30s?

Navigators 20s/30s is here to help 20s transition from Uni to the working world and for all people in their 20s/30s grow in skills that will help them thrive in this season of life. Our ministry is geared towards helping you thrive in your walk with God, both now and for a lifetime. We do this through our '**4 Pursuits**' (Christ, Vocation, Mission, and Generations). We want to help you by:

- Imparting practical skills for everyday life and work
- Equipping you to live as disciples of Jesus in our secular culture
- Growing your vision to be part of God's mission and kingdom work wherever he has called you
- Mentoring you one-to-one and giving you a vision for spiritual generations

We're inviting you to join us as we launch Navigators 20s/30s for 2023. In addition to the '**4 Pursuits**', we have identified **5 key areas** that people in their 20s/30s need help with to grow in this season of life. Our goal is to foster local and national connections for you and to provide regular content and opportunities to learn and discuss these significant topics with others.

Topics we will cover in 2023...

Using the analogy of "five big rocks" in our lives that we need to grow in Biblical alignment with, the broad themes of the year will be: TIME, MONEY, WORK, RELATIONSHIPS, and SEXUALITY.

What does this involve?

- Online national webinars with local discussion groups that you can invite friends to.
- Meeting with a Navigators mentor in your city 1x/month or more often if it fits your schedule. You can still attend events if you don't have a mentor, but we highly value the benefits of one-to-one interaction that a mentoring relationship brings.
- 1 retreat per year (August 2023 in Auckland)
- Strong encouragement and help to be serving and intentionally reaching out in your local relational context.
- Optional – additional Bible study or a mission trip to an unreached people group

Why do I need this?

As followers of Jesus, we are all called to a life of apprenticeship to Jesus and living out our God given mission. But what does this practically look like in real life? How does following Jesus impact how I use my time, how I manage my money, and how I view my work and my relationships? We want to help you by focusing on these key areas that you are going to have to navigate in your 20s and 30s. Also, we recognise your need for community and for someone to walk alongside you in your life-long spiritual journey. *Who is with you on your spiritual journey?*

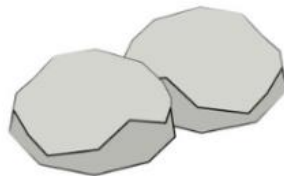
