

# BEING RENEWED IN MISSIONS

God invites us to be involved in the advance of the gospel into our neighbourhood and relational networks, into Aotearoa, and into other nations. Recently I realised that two well-known Bible passages contain this global view. In John 3:16 we see how God's love for all nations (the world) motivated the gift of Jesus' life for the salvation of all who believe in Jesus. When we pray the Lord's prayer, we pray for God's will to be done in all nations. It is too easy to translate 'world' to only mean our small corner of the globe.

In January 2000 my family moved to Fergusson Hall where I worked as manager of this Hall of Residence for Massey university students. I remember praying for the gospel to transform the lives of students in the Hall, and for these students to carry the message of Jesus around New Zealand and to other nations. Students who came to faith at Fergusson Hall and grew as believers went on the carry the gospel to many parts of Aotearoa and into several countries in Asia and other parts of the world.

When we pray only for our neighbourhood, for our city, or even for our nation are we settling for too small a thing with God? Could God's message to the prophet Isaiah be a message to us too? "It is too small a thing for you to be my servant to restore the tribes of Jacob and bring back those of Israel I have kept. I will also make you a light for the Gentiles, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth." - Isaiah 49:6

I find the challenge of reaching my immediate neighbours with the Good News about Jesus can diminish my vision for the gospel advancing into other nations. I need reminding of this global vision and for this to inform my prayers again as it did when I moved to Fergusson Hall.

A friend recently said, "the gospel without cross-cultural missions is like living in a stuffy room". We need to open the windows and let the fresh air in. May this issue of Navigate renew your vision and heart for cross-cultural missions and for the nations.

## RENEWED IN MISSIONS: GOD IS WITH US

GOD CALLS US TO BE HIS WITNESSES BUT DOES NOT LEAVE US TO GO IT ALONE

In Matthew 28:18–20 lesus commissioned His disciples to make disciples of all nations, to baptise them in the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit, and to teach them to obey everything that he commanded them to do. He completes this charge with a promise—a promise that *He* would be with them (and by inference us) to the end of the age. This promise is significant in that it assures us that we do not need to try to carry out this commission on our own.

A similar promise to the disciples from Jesus is found in Luke 24:49, "And behold, I am sending **the** need His help. What a tremendous encouragement **promise of my Father upon you**. But stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." Here the promise is the Father will be with them as they proclaim the message of repentance and forgiveness of sins to the nations beginning in Jerusalem.

In Acts 1:7, Jesus answers a question from the disciples about the restoration of Israel's kingdom explaining that it is not yet time for it to be restored (cf. Acts 3:19-21). However, as Luke records in Acts 1:8 (read below), the time for the mission of Spirit-empowered witness to the nations has come. Isaiah had already promised that God's Spirit would empower his people to testify for him to the nations, even "to the ends of


the earth" (Isaiah 43:10-12; 44:3, 8; 49:6; cf. Acts 13:47).

The promised Holy Spirit would be with them and empower them as they fulfil the charge to take the gospel to the ends of the earth. The disciples received the Spirit from Jesus to enable them to be His witnesses. They went out to the world with the gospel message: that Jesus has come but has now died, risen to life, and ascended to heaven.

God's people now are promised the presence of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit in this mission of living as His witnesses, proclaiming the gospel, and making disciples of all nations. God knows we this should be to us as we carry out this mission of spreading the gospel from where God has planted us—to the ends of the earth!

The Spirit empowers us in reaching the world for Christ. The same Spirit who enabled the prophets to speak for God, the same Spirit who anointed Jesus for his mission, the same Spirit who empowered the first followers of Jesus for their mission in Acts, is the same Spirit who empowers us to reach the world today.

As the Spirit empowers and renews us for mission - let us be faithful to transmit the gospel of Jesus and His Kingdom in His power in our local cities, to the surrounding areas, to our nation, and to our world—around the globe.

When you think about Christmas, perhaps your mind doesn't instantly turn to thinking about mission. And yet mission is embedded in the angel's proclamation of good news to the shepherds at the first heralding of Jesus' birth. Jesus would be good news and this good news would be for all people.

I was thinking about good news recently during a walk with a non-believing friend. During our walk, I was able to rejoice with her in a seemingly miraculous outcome for her family member that I had been praying for (and remind her that I had been praying for this). I also shared about God's grace in helping me to overcome a personal challenge. It occurred to me that in doing these things I was, in a small way, also proclaiming the good news.

Our nation of Aotearoa New Zealand is about as far-flung as you can get from where those shepherds first heard the good news. But as we "live and disciple among the lost," as our Navigator calling statement describes it, we can proclaim God's good news as we see and experience it to the people on our streets, in our workplaces, our schools, sports teams and families.

Remember that the birth of a fragile baby born to peasants was an incredibly humble start to something as unfathomably large as the redemption of the world. So, this Christmas, can we share God's good news from our own lives, no matter how small and insignificant our stories seem? Good news is meant to be proclaimed! Only God knows how He will use our small offerings to bring His good news to all people.



Do you have a longing to invest in the spiritual growth of someone else but don't know where to start? ### RENEWED IN MISSIONS: FAMILIES & RELATIONAL NETWORKS

JOIN US AS WE LOOK AT AND STUDY TOGETHER OUR NAVIGATORS CORE VALUE #8— HOW GOD USES FAMILIES AND RELATIONAL NETWORKS IN DISCIPLING THE NATIONS

Have you ever thought about the importance of families and relational networks have in the advance of the gospel? What part (if any) did your family and close friends play in your journey to God? What emotions surface now at the thought of the gospel impacting your family of origin?

- 1. READ: Genesis 18:17-19. From this passage and your knowledge of Abraham and Sarah's legacy, what part did Abraham and his descendants play in discipling the nation of Israel?
- 2. Jesus and His disciples believed that affecting one person with the gospel opened the door to affect that person's family and network of relationships, if he/she stays connected relationally. Choose two of these stories. Summarize one or two insights about discipling the nations through families and/or friendship networks.

READ: Mark 5:18-20; Acts 10:48; & Acts 11:11-17

3. The believers in the Greek metropolis of Thessalonica exemplified a relational community that God used to influence the spiritual fabric of that capital city and its surrounding geographical regions. Before you read about them, locate Thessalonica, Macedonia, and Achaia on a map of that area. As you read about them, take notes on what you learn from the Thessalonians that we could ask God to do in our own lives, families, neighborhoods, and ministries. READ: 1 Thessalonians 1:1-10; 2:13,14; 3:6; & 4:9-12.

PROJECT: Ask several friends who or what influenced their coming to faith in Jesus. Listen for any influence of family and close relationships. Jot down their responses. Does this fit with your view of how the gospel spreads? Why or why not? Why not grab a friend and study and discuss this topic together.
